#### **Context Statement**

Renmark High School caters for students from 7-12. At the time of this report, the enrolment in 2024 is 466. Renmark High School is classified as Category 3 on the Department for Education Index of Educational Disadvantage. At the time of this report, the school population includes 13% Aboriginal students, 10% students with disabilities, 5% students with English as an additional language or dialect (EALD) funded background, 2% children/young people in care. This year saw the establishment of the school's values: Respect, Connect, and Achieve. The school was enhanced with signage reinforcing these values, and I believe their influence has been reflected in the achievements of both the student body and staff throughout the year.

Our student body has made some notable achievements within the school, as well as in sporting and wider community settings. Congratulations to all our awards winners in both academic and sporting fields – you are a testament to the talent and determination within our school.

We also saw some great initiatives continue within the school this year. The Paediatric Clinic, sponsored by the Renmark Medical Clinic, returned to provide medical care to students. Once again, our children were able to access free healthcare consultations with a junior doctor on school grounds. The University Assessment Days also continued with Flinders University visiting the school to offer an alternative to ATAR scores.

There have been some exciting additions to our school this year. With the help of a grant from the South Australian Cricket Association, a brand-new cricket pitch has been installed. We were also fortunate to receive a National Safe Space grant of \$15,000 to support renovations to the toilets. Additionally, we've recently purchased a new school bus, which will make camps and excursions more accessible for everyone.



# Performance Summary NAPLAN Proficiency





#### **Attendance Comment**

In South Australia, all children and young people must be in school from 6 years to 16 years old. They must attend a government or non-government school full time. From age 16 to 17 however, young people must attend school or an approved learning program (such as an apprenticeship, traineeship, accredited course or university). Schools and parents must encourage and support students to come to school every day. Parents and caregivers must make sure their child is enrolled in a school, and attends school all day and everyday it is open, unless a child is sick or has an approved exemption. Teachers and leaders actively follow up when a student misses school, including recording all absences and non-attendance. All schools in South Australia have local attendance procedures governed under the Education and Children's Services Regulations 2020.
